Merit scholarships are also available to continuing students. Contact the Theatre and Media Arts Department for more information.</p> <p>FACILITIES:</p> <p>The Media Arts Studies program has multiple student production facilities. The TMA open computer lab provides beginning students with access to digital production and editing facilities. The Media Arts Lab (MAL) provides advanced sound and image editing stations. The MAL Checkout provides advanced film and digital camera, lighting, and sound production equipment, as well as advanced post-production sound and editing facilities. Core curriculum of critical studies develops analytical skills and creates a foundation for application and experimentation; a wide range of electives allows additional emphasis in critical studies, fiction or non-fiction (documentary) production, or other specialized areas.</p>
